



2026 Township Profiles:

Demographics of the Aging Population in Suburban Cook County



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1. Executive Summary

1.1 AgeOptions: Who We Are and Who We Serve

AgeOptions is the Area Agency on Aging of Suburban Cook County, Illinois, which includes all of Cook County except the city of Chicago. AgeOptions is one of 13 Area Agencies on Aging in Illinois. With our local partners, we help older adults as well as family caregivers, of any age. In fiscal year 2025, AgeOptions and our community partners served 196,778 people.

The number of older adults in suburban Cook County is growing quickly and the population is becoming more diverse. There are 618,385 adults age 60 and older living in suburban Cook County. Of these individuals, 1 in 3 are part of racially and ethnically diverse communities, 1 in 7 have limited English proficiency, and 1 in 4 live alone.

1.2 Township Profiles: Why We Use Townships and What is Included

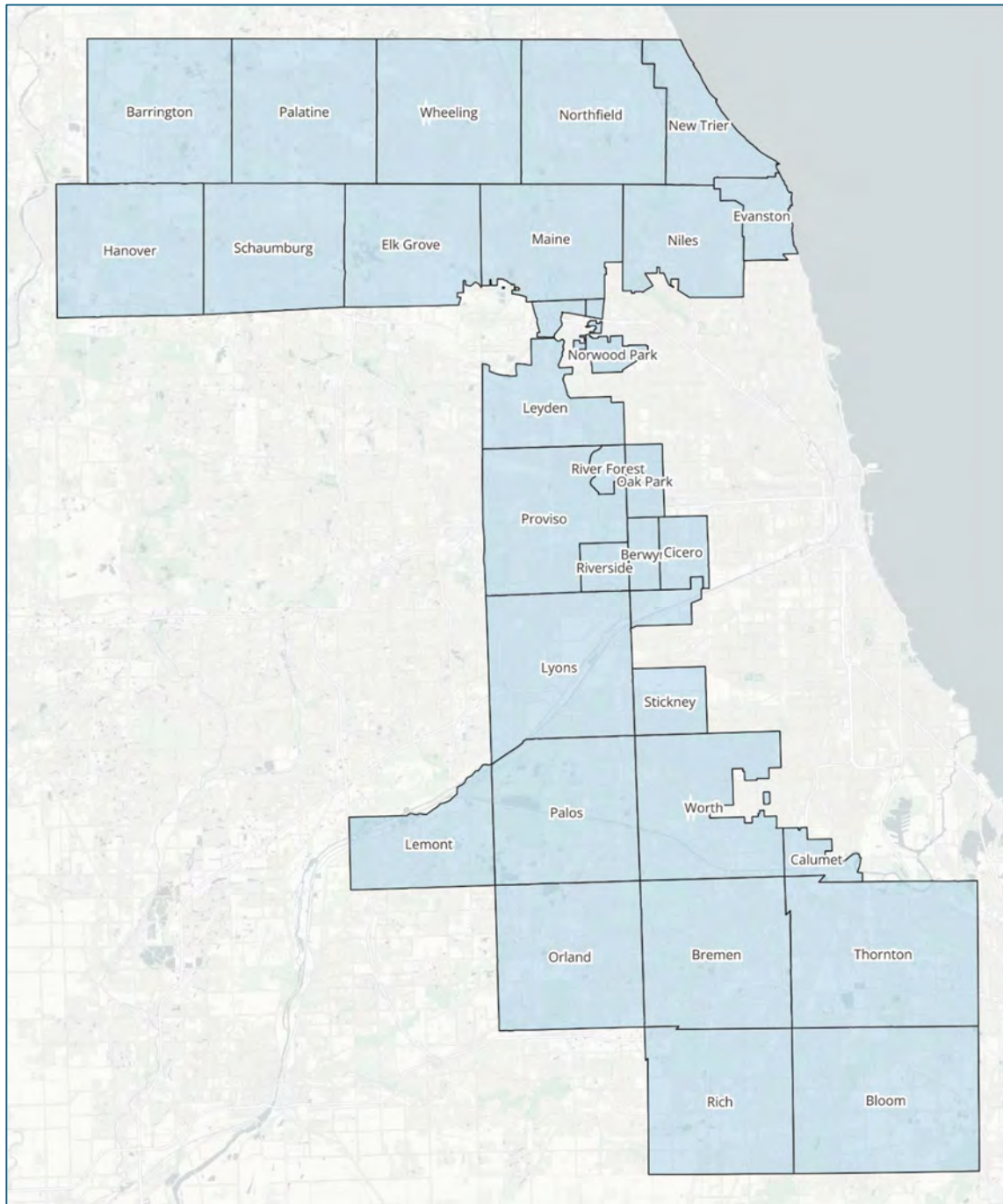


Figure 1. Townships of Suburban Cook County

Part of AgeOptions job is to understand the needs of older adults in suburban Cook County and plan services to meet those needs. Our service area has more than 2.47 million people, so we need to look at smaller local areas to better understand each community. Suburban Cook County includes 29 townships and the City of Evanston (see Figure 1). These townships include more than 130 municipalities.

We created the following Township Profiles to show local information about adults age 60 and older as well as offer a glimpse into the considerations that factor in our planning processes. The profiles allow us to compare 30 local areas and point out important differences among older adult populations. We hope local communities, service providers, elected officials, and residents will use these profiles to better understand local needs and speak up for older adults in their area.

This document includes 30 profiles (one for each area) and one profile for all of suburban Cook County. Each profile uses information from the most recent American Community Survey from the U.S. Census Bureau. The profiles include:

- Age groups (60 years or older, 75 years or older, and 85 years or older)
- Poverty: residents age 60 and older whose income is below the federal poverty level
 - The federal poverty level is an income amount set by the U.S. government and updated each year. It is often used to decide who can get certain benefits or financial help.
- Living alone: one person age 60 or older living in a household by themselves
- Race and ethnicity of residents age 60 and older
- Household characteristics for owners or renters age 60 or older, including receipt of SNAP benefits or a large share of income spent on housing costs. (See Appendix B for what owner and renter costs include as well as more information about “cost burden.”)



Five townships have smaller populations, so our usual data sources do not provide data for these less populated areas. For those five townships, we use similar information from other Census sources. These are the last five townships in our document, and we include a short introduction to explain what is different about their data.

1.3 How Can Readers Use the Township Profiles?

Each township profile includes data for all of suburban Cook County in a column labeled “% for 60+ Suburban Cook.” This makes it easy to compare one township with the larger area. For example, 25% of older adults in suburban Cook County live alone, so you can see whether your township is higher or lower than that number and ask why.

You can also compare data within one township. For example, you can compare the share of older adults living in poverty with the share of households receiving food or SNAP benefits. In many cases, more households may receive SNAP than live below the poverty level because people can qualify for SNAP at somewhat higher income levels. But if more people are living in poverty than receiving SNAP, that may be a sign that more outreach is needed. In that case, you may want to contact AgeOptions about SNAP outreach.

1.4 What We Learned – Key Findings

The following are key findings from the data gathered and organized for this report.

The older adult population in suburban Cook County is growing fast. Since 2014, the number of adults age 60 and older has grown by more than 20%, reaching 618,385 people. This growth occurred in nearly every township in the region.

More older adults are living below the poverty line. In 2014, 7.6% of adults 60 and older had incomes below the Federal Poverty Line. By 2024, that share rose to 9.5%. For reference, the 2024 Federal Poverty Line for a one-person household was \$15,050 for adults 65 and older. The range across townships is wide – from 3.8% below the poverty line in New Trier township to 19.5% in Calumet Township and 17.1% in Thornton Township. SNAP participation among older adults also grew during this period across the region. Like poverty rates, program participation rates varied widely across townships, ranging from 2.7% to 20.1% of the age-eligible population.

The region is becoming more racially and ethnically diverse. In 2014, 24.1% of older adults were from racially and ethnically diverse communities. By 2024, that share grew to 33.5%, one in three older adults. Again, the range across townships is substantial. Lemont and Palos townships had the highest shares of non-Hispanic white older adults, while Calumet, Thornton, Cicero, and Rich townships had the highest shares of racially and ethnically diverse older adults.

English language proficiency varies significantly. In Cicero Township, 53.8% of older adults speak English less than very well, nearly double the next highest township, Leyden, at 28.9%.

Housing costs remain a burden for many older adults. The share of older adult renters spending more than 30% of their income on housing dropped slightly, but 55.2% still face this financial strain. Older adults who own their homes are less likely to be cost burdened, but nearly one in three homeowners still spend 30% or more of their income on ownership costs like mortgage and property taxes.



Readers may find additional insights as they explore individual township profiles and apply their own knowledge of local communities, residents, and agencies. These estimates offer one specific lens. We hope they serve as a useful starting point for conversations and reflections toward understanding each community and the people who live there.



2. Defining Common Terms

- **Older Adult:** When AgeOptions says “older adults,” we generally mean people age 60 and older. Where a specific statistic refers to a different age range (for example, 65 and older), that range is noted alongside the number.
- **Suburban Cook County:** The part of Cook County, Illinois that lies outside the City of Chicago. It is made up of 29 townships and the City of Evanston (see Figure 1).
- **Township Profiles:** The demographic summaries collected in this document. Each profile is a single page covering one of the 30 areas in suburban Cook County (the 29 townships plus Evanston).
- **ACS:** The American Community Survey (ACS), run by the U.S. Census Bureau, is a large national survey that AgeOptions draws demographic information from for these profiles. See Appendix B for details and the specific tables used.
- **100% FPL:** FPL stands for the Federal Poverty Level, a national income threshold set each year by the federal government and used to determine who qualifies for many assistance programs. “100% FPL” means a household’s income is right at that line. Figures like “below 100% FPL” mean income falls under it. The threshold rises with household size, and a larger family can earn more and still fall below 100% FPL.
- **Household:** All the people that live in a single housing unit, such as a house or apartment, regardless of whether they are related. A person living alone counts as a household.
- **Householder:** The person (or one of the people) in whose name the home is owned or rented. The ACS uses the householder as a reference point for describing household characteristics and categorizing households by age.
- **SNAP:** The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) helps lower-income households buy food. It was formerly known as “food stamps.”
- **Cost-Burden:** A household is cost-burdened when it spends a large share of its income (30% or more) on rent or other housing costs. The higher the share, the heavier the burden housing places on the household’s finances. This 30% threshold comes from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).



3. Suburban Cook County Profile

The following profile covers suburban Cook County as a whole. The values shown here appear as a reference column in each township profile (labeled “% for 60+ Suburban Cook”), so readers can compare local township data to the full suburban Cook County area.

All data come from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey (ACS) 5-year estimates, which are used throughout to allow comparisons across all 30 townships and the whole service area.

The data in this profile reflect the 2024 ACS 5-year estimates and most are drawn from Subject Table S0102.

- Data for adults 75 and older and 85 and older come from Detailed Table B01001, which provides more detail for those age groups.
- A chart showing the 60 and older population over time also includes 2014 and 2019 estimates from B01001.

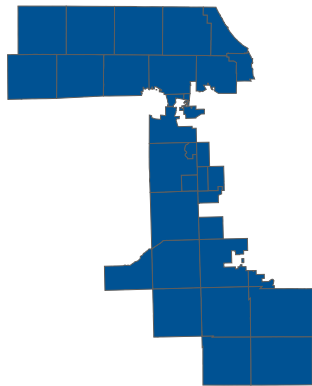
Household characteristics, including SNAP benefits, cost burdened renter households, and cost burdened owner households, reflect the demographics of only the householder (the person in whose name the residence is owned or rented) and are limited to households where the householder is 60 or older.

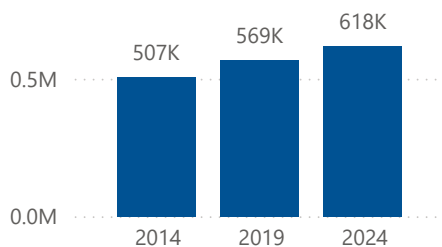

4. Township Profiles

The following 30 profiles cover each township in suburban Cook County, organized into two groups: the 25 more populous townships and the 5 less populous townships (Barrington, Calumet, Lemont, River Forest, and Riverside).

All data come from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey (ACS) 5-year estimates, enabling comparisons across all 30 townships and the full service area.

The two-group structure reflects data availability. The primary data source used throughout (Table S0102) is not available for the 5 less populous townships due to smaller sample sizes, and alternate Census tables for these townships sometimes provide data only at the 65 and older threshold. Even with alternate data sources, some of the estimates based on very small sample sizes are too imprecise to report reliably. To avoid presenting potentially misleading figures, these estimates have been left blank on the tables.

All 30 profiles showcase the following:

- Age cohort counts and percentages for older adult age groups, alongside the change in the 60+ population from 2014 to 2024
- Demographic characteristics presented as count and percentage, with the suburban Cook County figure provided as a reference point for each characteristic.
- Race and ethnicity counts and percentages, sorted from highest to lowest count. Only groups comprising at least 5% of the township's 60+ population are included.
- Household characteristics, including SNAP receipt, rent cost burden, and homeownership cost burden.
- U.S. House, Illinois House, and Illinois Senate districts intersecting with township boundaries. Because voting district boundaries do not align neatly with townships, a district is included if any geographic overlap exists. Representative names will be updated periodically — readers should verify current districts and representatives at www.house.gov/representatives/find-your-representative and www.elections.il.gov.

Percentages at least 5 percentage points above the Suburban Cook County value for the same characteristic are highlighted to draw attention to areas where the township's older adult population deviates notably from the suburban Cook County average.

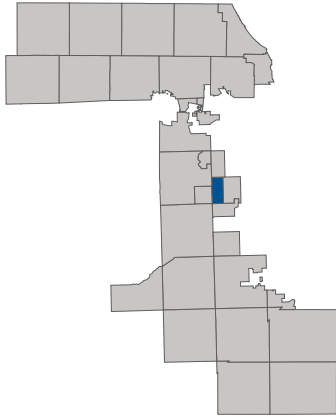

Demographic Profile: Berwyn Township

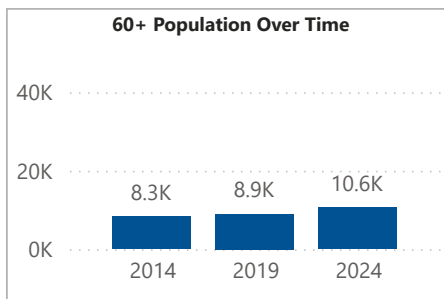

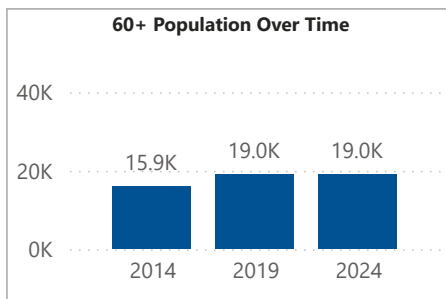

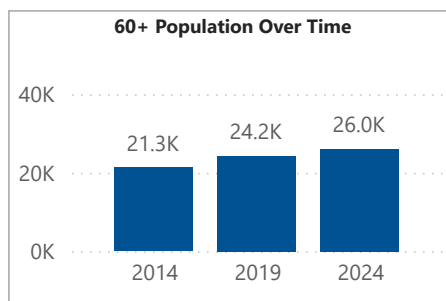

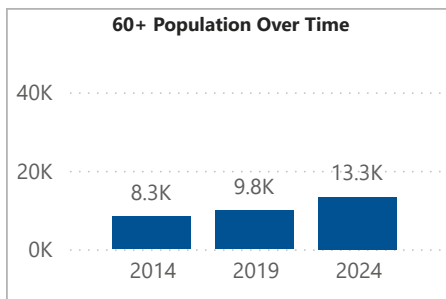

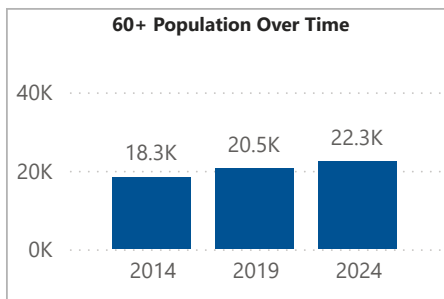

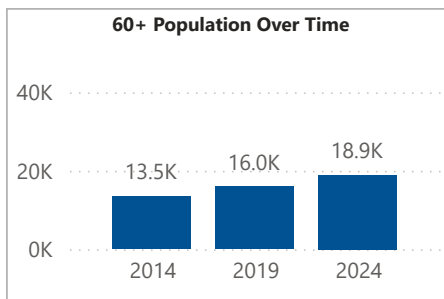

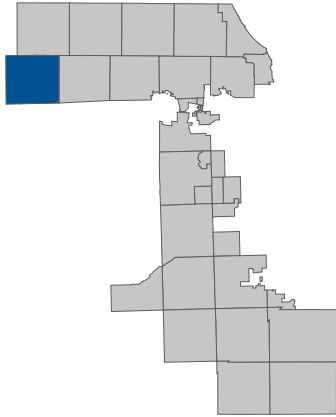

Demographic Profile: Hanover Township

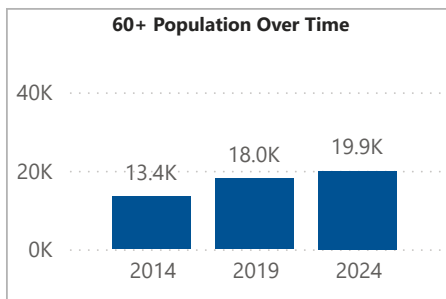

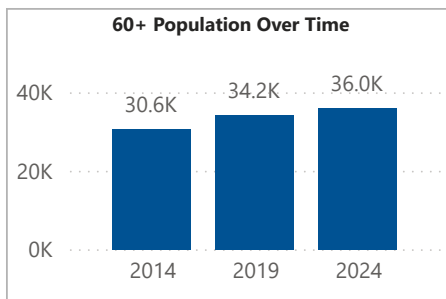

4.2 5 Less Populous Townships

The following 5 profiles cover the less populous townships in suburban Cook County. Because of their small populations, the dataset used for the other 25 township profiles (Subject Table S0102) does not produce reliable estimates for these townships. Instead, these profiles draw from ACS Detailed Tables, with the specific table cited for each characteristic in Appendix B.

One important difference: where Subject Table S0102, used for the other 25 profiles, reports data for adults 60 and older, the available detailed tables used for these 5 townships often report data for 65 and older as the age threshold. As a result, these profiles mix 60+ and 65+ figures depending on data availability, and each row clearly labels the age group shown.

For consistency, the suburban Cook County reference column in these profiles is also drawn from detailed tables to match the age groupings used, so those values may differ slightly from the suburban Cook County overview profile and from the reference column in the 25 more populous township profiles.

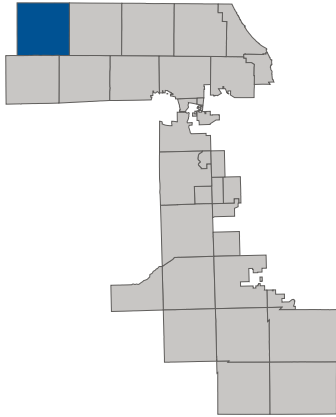

Appendix A: Township Comparison Tables

Appendix A presents historical data for all 30 townships across eight characteristics related to older adults, shown as both counts and percentages. The tables list the township of suburban Cook County in rows, with columns showing values for 2014, 2019, and 2024, allowing readers to track changes over time within a township and compare townships to one another. The eight characteristics are:

- Adults 60+
- Adults 60+ living below 100% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL)
- Adults 60+ living alone
- Adults 60+ who identify as a racial or ethnic minority, defined here as anyone other than non-Hispanic white
- Adults 60+ who speak English less than "very well"
- Households where the householder is 60+ that receive SNAP benefits
- Renter households with a householder 60+ spending more than 30% of household income on gross rent
- Owner households with a householder 60+ spending more than 30% of household income on housing costs (mortgage, insurance, utilities, and HOA fees)

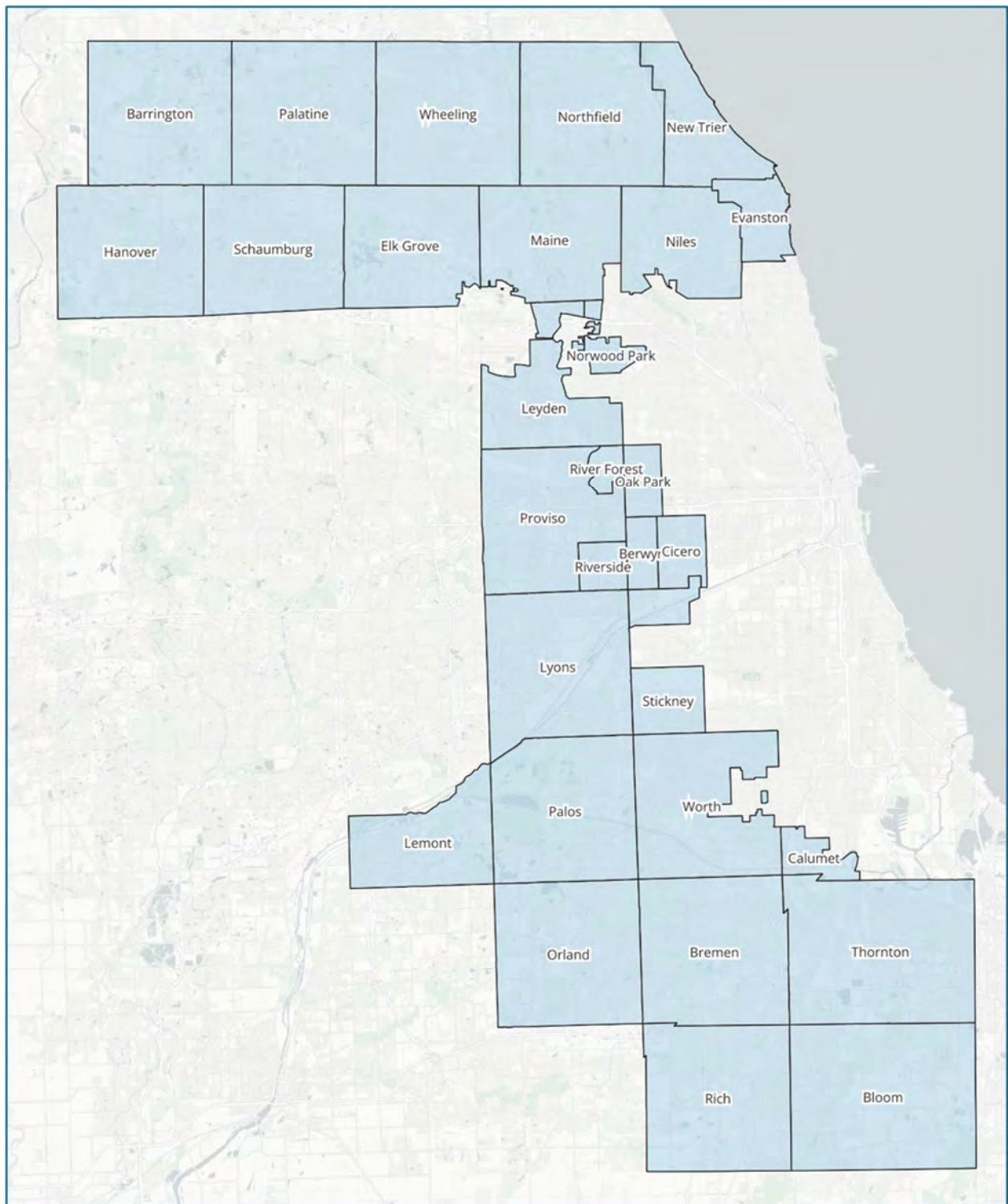


Figure 2. Townships of Suburban Cook County (repeated for convenience)

Each table includes a map of townships shaded in blue based on 2024 values. Darker blue indicates a higher value; white indicates the lowest. A township map is repeated in this section for readers' convenience (Figure 2).

Blue data bars within each cell of the table provide an additional visual indicator of relative differences across townships.

Due to alternate data sources, the five less populous townships (Barrington, Calumet, Lemont, River Forest, and Riverside) are listed separately in a table that does not include the blue data bar indicator. If data sources for these townships were only available for the age 65 or older age group, the table is clearly labeled "65+ Population." These townships are also shaded grey in the map to avoid comparing values for different population groups. Due to smaller sample sizes, these estimates may have larger margins of error and should be interpreted with caution. When sample sizes are too small to report a reliable estimate, no estimate is given and an empty gray box is shown instead. See Appendix B for more information.

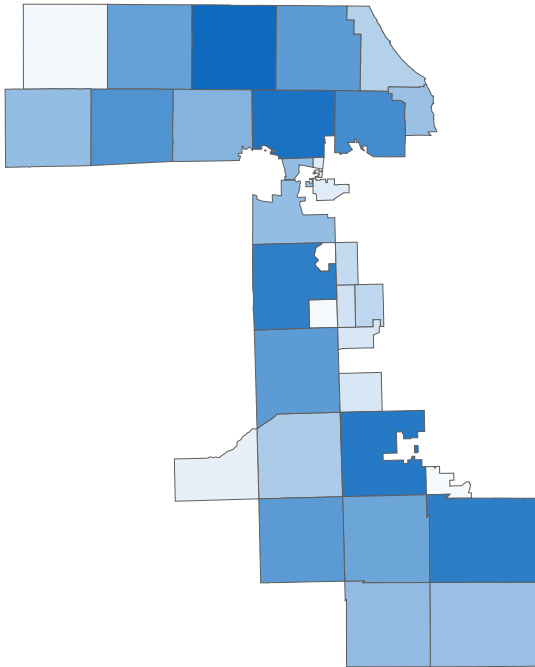

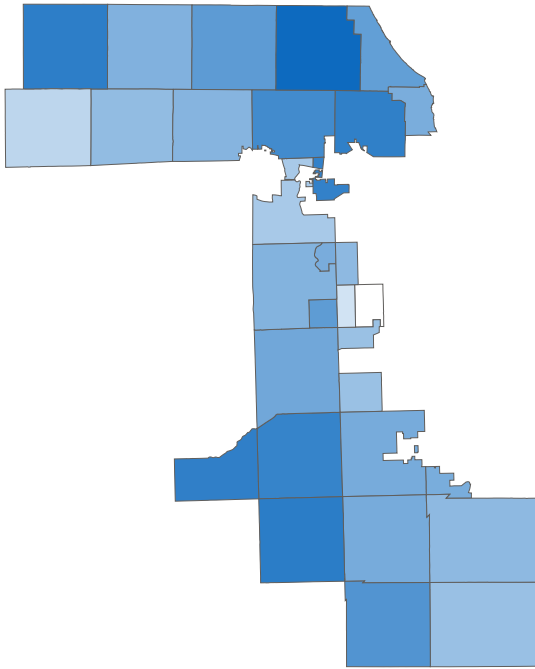

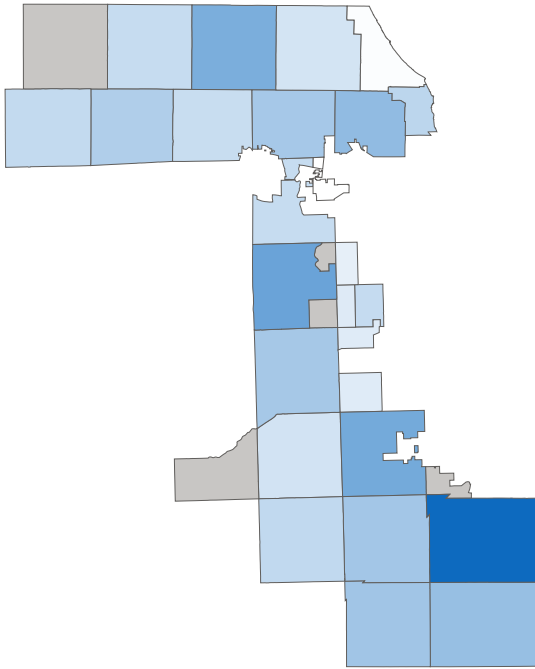

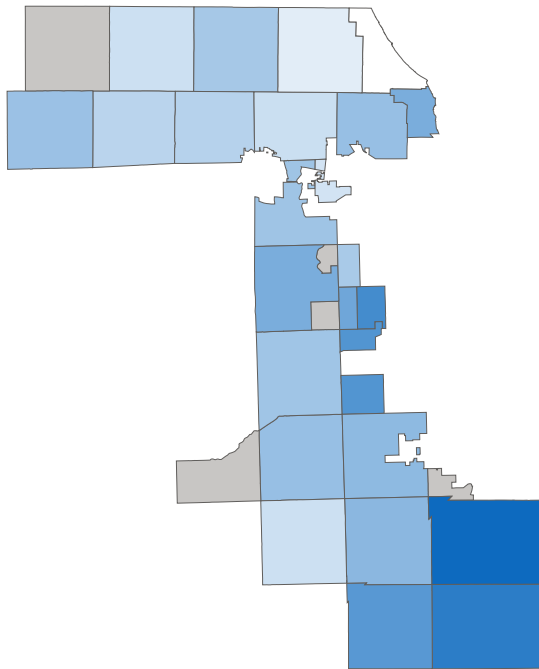

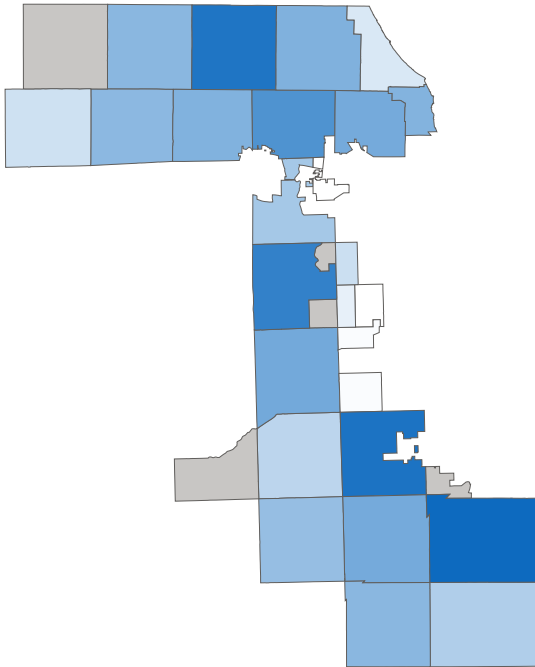

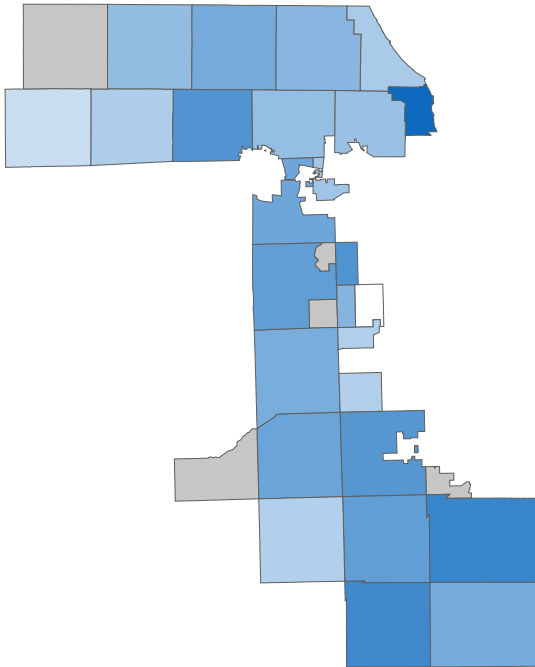

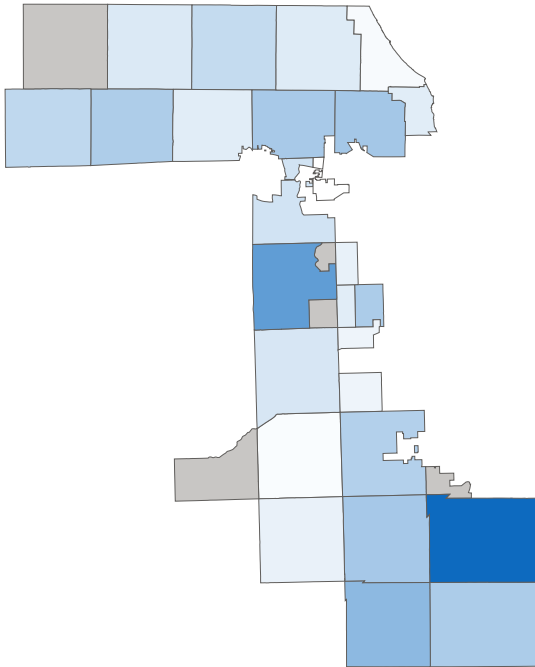

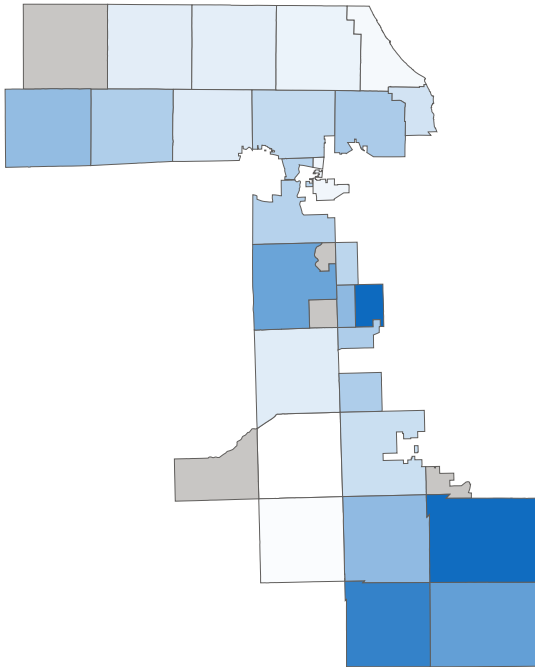

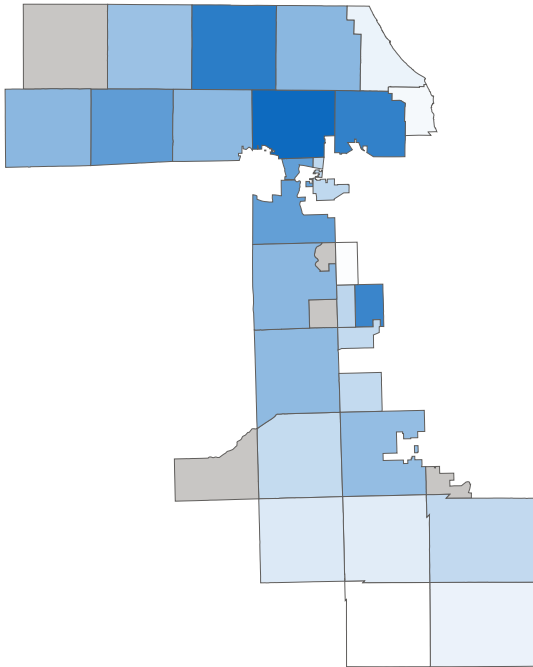

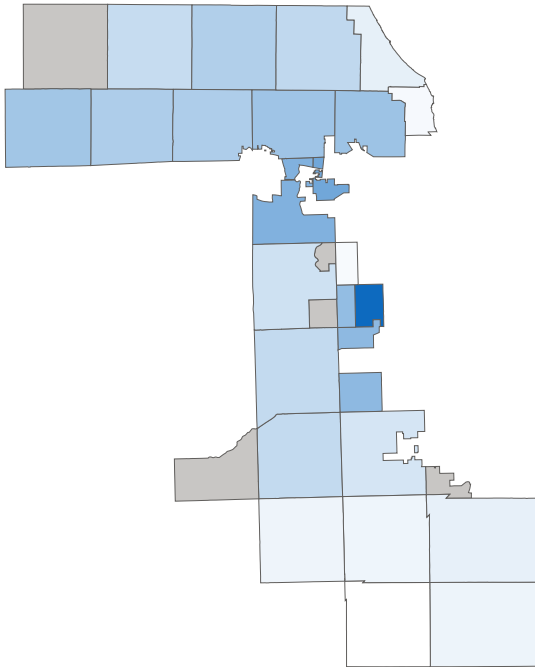

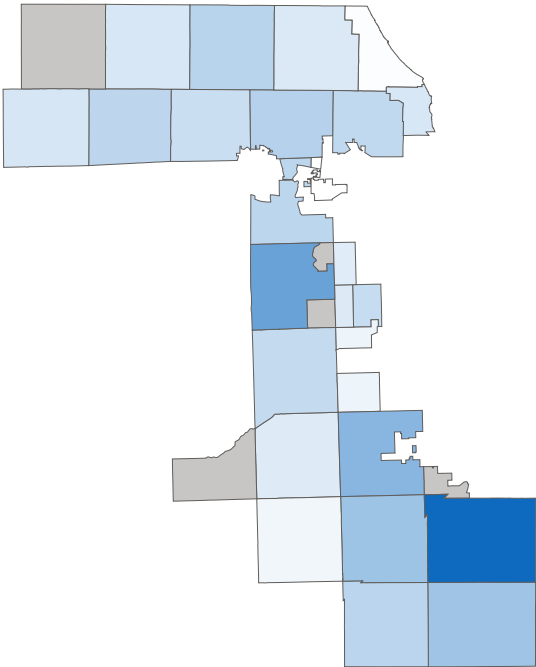

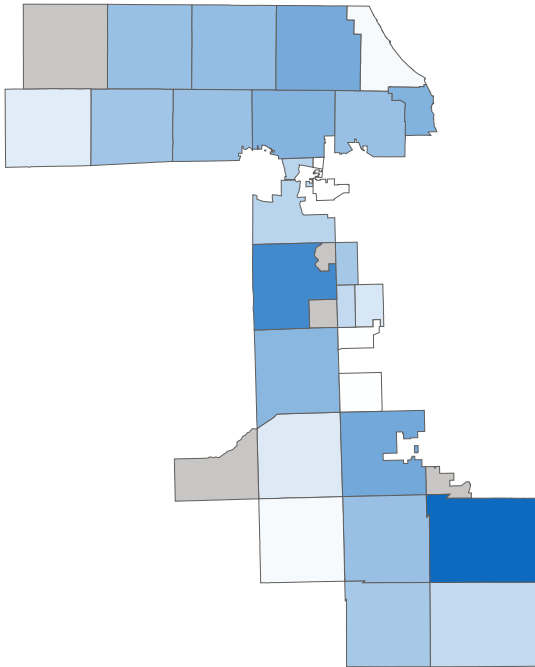

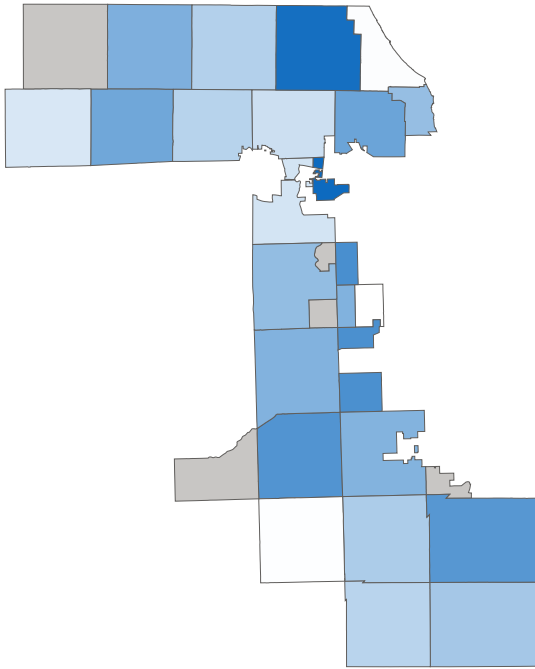

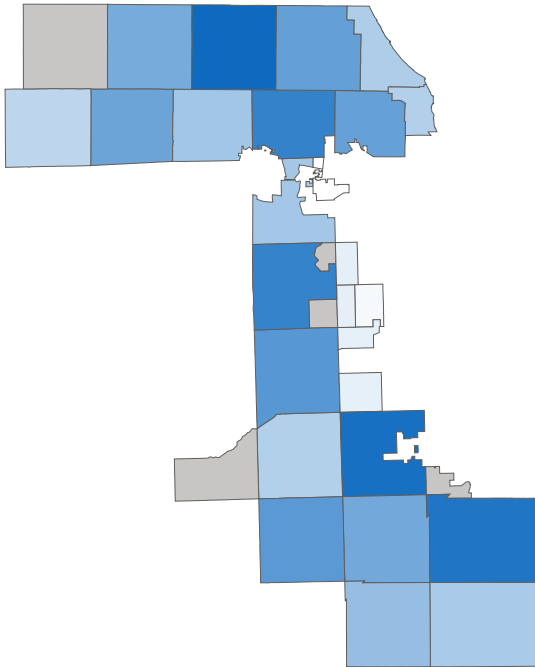

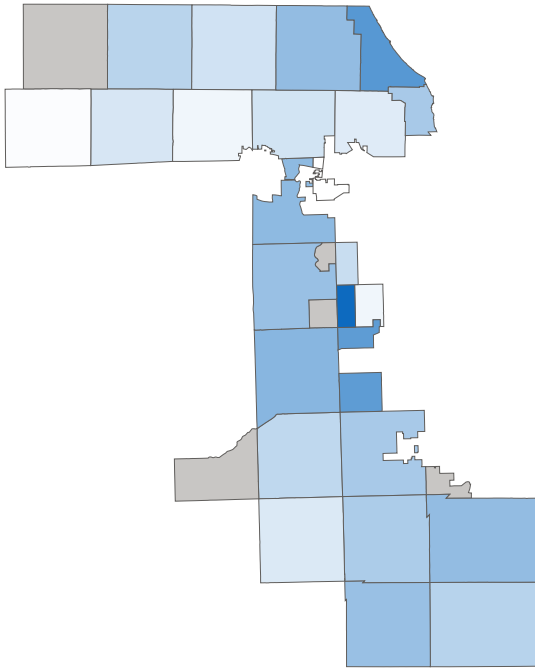

Appendix B: Methodology and Data Sources

This appendix documents the methodology and data sources underlying all estimates and percentages in this report. It is intended to promote transparency and support reproducibility, and the language is accordingly more technical and detailed than the main report.

Methodology

Data Sources

Data in this report are drawn from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey (ACS). The primary source for suburban Cook County and the 25 more populous township profiles is Subject Table S0102, which provides pre-tabulated estimates for the population 60 and older. S0102 is not published for geographies below a certain population threshold; for the five less populous township profiles, ACS Detailed Tables were used as an alternative source. ACS Detailed Tables were also used for 75 and older and 85 and older age groups, the longitudinal population chart, and all data in Appendix A.

Estimate Type and Vintage

All estimates are from the ACS 5-year series, which represents a period estimate averaged over 60 months rather than a single reference point. The 2024 5-year estimates (2020–2024) are the primary vintage used throughout. Appendix A additionally incorporates 2014 and 2019 5-year estimates to support longitudinal comparison.

Counts and Percentages

S0102 publishes percentage estimates and universe totals but does not directly publish underlying counts. Where counts are displayed alongside percentages for S0102-sourced characteristics, those counts were derived by applying the published percentage to the published universe total. These figures are approximations and may differ slightly from true underlying counts due to rounding in the published percentage. Published S0102 percentages are displayed without modification.

For characteristics sourced from ACS Detailed Tables, percentages were independently calculated from published counts and rounded to the nearest tenth of a percent.

Poverty percentages are calculated out of the population for whom poverty status is determined, rather than the total older adult population. The Census Bureau does not assign a poverty status to everyone. For instance, people living in institutional settings such as nursing homes, or in college dormitories and other group quarters, fall outside the poverty universe. For the 60 and older population, these exclusions tend to represent a small share of the total, so the denominator generally stays close to the overall older adult count.

Living-alone percentages are calculated out of older adults living in households, rather than the total older adult population. This leaves out older adults living in group quarters (such as residents of assisted



living facilities or other institutional settings) since "living alone" describes a household arrangement that doesn't readily apply in those settings. As with poverty, this group tends to be a small portion of the older adult population, so the two denominators usually stay fairly close.

Margin of Error

All ACS estimates carry a margin of error (MOE) reflecting sampling variability, and estimates for smaller geographies and subpopulations tend to have greater sampling error. Where feasible, published aggregate estimates were used rather than summing component cells. When estimates were combined, margins of error were propagated accordingly.

Estimates were suppressed and left blank when the coefficient of variation (CV) exceeded 0.40, indicating that sampling error was too large relative to the estimate to support reliable interpretation. The CV is calculated as the ratio of the standard error to the estimate, derived from the published margin of error at the 90% confidence level. In practice, this affected relatively few estimates, concentrated among the five least populous townships, where small subgroup counts occasionally fell below this reliability threshold.

Race and Ethnicity

The racial and ethnic minority category used in this report is defined as all individuals except those identifying as non-Hispanic white alone. Hispanic or Latino is not a mutually exclusive category in ACS data, and respondents may identify as Hispanic or Latino in combination with any racial group. As a result, aggregated racial and ethnic percentages may sum to more than 100% and should not be interpreted as mutually exclusive shares of the population.

Race and ethnicity tables in this report list groups from largest to smallest by count and include only groups comprising at least 5% of the total population.

Household Characteristics

Household characteristics describe the household as a unit rather than the individual older adults living within it. Characteristics related to household economics, including receipt of SNAP benefits, cost burdened renter households, and cost burdened owner households, are tabulated based on the demographics of the householder (i.e., the person under whose name the housing unit is owned or rented).

Housing cost burden is defined as spending more than 30% of income on housing. This designation is defined and used as a benchmark by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to indicate that a household may struggle to afford other basic needs.

Because the ACS collects housing cost data separately for owners and renters, cost burden is presented as two distinct figures. These figures are limited to households where the householder meets the applicable age threshold (60 and older in most profiles; 60 and older or 65 and older in the five less populous township profiles and Appendix A, depending on data availability). Households where the



householder does not meet the age threshold are excluded regardless of whether other household members do.

For owner households, housing costs include mortgage payments, property taxes, insurance, utilities, and condominium fees where applicable. For renter households, costs reflect gross rent only.

Householders Living Alone

The share of older adults living alone is presented as an individual-level estimate rather than a household-level estimate. This figure was calculated by dividing the count of householders age 60 and older living alone by the total population living in households age 60 and older. This approach assumes that a one-person household contains exactly one individual, making the householder count equivalent to an individual count. In the five less populous township profiles as well as Appendix A, where detailed table availability requires a 65 and older age group, both the numerator (householders 65 and older living alone) and denominator (total population 65 and older) shift accordingly.

AgeOptions primarily serves individuals rather than households, and the populations most relevant to our work are older adults themselves, not the households in which they reside. While the Census Bureau measures living alone at the household level, what matters most from a service planning perspective is the share of older adults who live without others in the home. Framing this indicator as the percentage of the 60+ population living alone (rather than the percentage of households) keeps the denominator focused on actual and potential service recipients, making the measure more directly actionable for program planning and resource allocation.

Legislative Districts

Each township profile includes the U.S. House, Illinois House, and Illinois Senate districts that intersect with the township boundary. A district is included if any geographic overlap exists between the district and the township, regardless of the extent of that overlap. Representative names will be updated periodically.
